At Stoughton Infant School we want all our children to develop a love of learning. We believe that the children achieve the best possible outcomes when we work together in partnership. Together we will support our children to be the best they can be.

School

These are our commitments to you:

- We will provide a high quality, safe and caring learning environment
- We will teach and encourage the children to make the best possible progress
- We will teach your child to develop a positive attitude towards others, regardless of gender, race, culture and beliefs
- We will set regular homework tasks that are linked to learning in the classroom
- We will let you know if your child has a difficulty or problem at school and will discuss ways in which we can help
- We will be available to talk with you at short notice if you have a concern, worry or query and we will listen carefully and agree ways in which we can help
- We will offer three parents consultation meetings
- We will provide you with next steps to support your child following parents consultations and an end of year report
- We will welcome you into the classroom once every half term for a 'Flaunt it Friday' where you can see your child's work alongside them
- We will communicate between home and school through, newsletter, Tapestry, the school website, meetings, parent workshops, social media (Twitter and Facebook) and ParentMail (text, email and forms)

Parents and Carers

These are your commitments to us:

- Play an active part in your child's education, recognising that education is a partnership and that we can achieve good outcomes if we work together
- Encourage tolerance and respect of others, regardless of gender, race, culture or beliefs
- Ensure your child has good and punctual attendance; making sure they arrive in time for the doors opening
- Make sure you do not take holidays during term time. We are not allowed to authorise days off unless the circumstances is classed as exceptional e.g. funeral
- Make sure your child wears school uniform, including black shoes and has the correct PE kit
- Support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour
- Share books with your child every day and encourage a love of reading
- Support your child with their homework tasks
- Read all the correspondence sent home
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to your details
- Support the school's approach to online safety

• Talk to someone in school if you have any concerns or if there are problems at home which may affect your child's progress.
